The Petition of *Robert J. Harrison* of the Town ship of *Ameliasburg* in the *Middlesex* District, Province of Upper Canada, humbly sheweth that your Petitioner is the son of *Sergeant William Harrison* of the Town ship of *Marysburg* in the *Middlesex* District, a U. E. LOYALIST. That your Petitioner has attained the age of twenty-one years, and has never received any Land or order for Land from the Crown. Your Petitioner therefore prays that Your Excellency will be pleased to grant unto him two hundred acres of the waste Lands of the Crown, and permit *Robert J. Harrison* to be his Agent to locate the same, and to receive the Patent when completed. And as in duty bound will ever pray.
