Archibald Harrison married Sarah Contor of the last farm on the Day side. Her father, Hrin Connor walked to Coronto for a law suit previous to the time of rallroad, in about 24 hrs. Their children were:-

Mancy Waggoner; Ellenora Powers; Catherine Hall of Utica; Ally Doyd of Gananoque; Emma Minaker; Thelismar of Drandon, Han. Edward I. of Cressy; Archibald of Cressy.

Walter Harrison married Mary Storms of Crossy. Their chiddren were: Danlel; Walter; Irvin on his father's farm by the lower Gross Road; Louisa matried Benjamin Harrison; Caroline married Storms; Clester married Isabel Slaver; Ida matried Irvin Hiller, Mahala.

George Harrison of Nochester has three children. George, William and Emma. Alex. Harrison had no family. Margaret Rennic of Mapanee had three daughters... Jane of Mapanee.....and a son John.

Joseph Allison married Mary Hoover, -their children were; David, John, Henry, Cyrus, Joseph, Edward, Amy Gonsolas, Elizabeth Dom Briden, Miriam of Shannonville, and Jane Hallory of Adolphustown.

Cyrus Allison married Eva Hoover,-their children were; Thoebe Jane who died young, Cyrus also died young, Withiam Henry, Eary Ann Appleby, Chas. Sarah Dranscombe( Gena Dranscombe's Hother) Jennie Roblin D.ewery.

David Allison married Amelia Hembery. Their family were.-Dr. David, John Denjamin, Raymond J., Mary Allison.

Nenry Allison marriedFartha Wright. Their family were,-Frederick and Harry, of Conway. The former remained on th the Lomestead.

Cyrus Illison married Catherine Murdock ... one son Roderick.

Joseph Allison married Martha Membery. Their family wore, - Annie Davis, Arthur, Edna of Monolulu.

Elizabeth Box had one son, Philip.

About: the year 1857 the mail from Mapance was taken from Adolphustown to Dongard's regularly. At that time two Furner boys lost their lives enroute during a great storm.

As dictated by Archibald Harrison about 1730. Only the foundation of the Hoover house remains today, portions of it having been used in Harrison's present home.

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# Historical Items of Adalphustown.

Henry Hoover of German descent, born 1763 and Jane Ann Huff of Hohawk Valley, New Fork State, born 1775, migrated with the United Empire Loyalists to Adolphustown, June 16th, 1704, with their parents. The government allotted approximately two hundred acres to each family. The Hoover house, on the present Harrison farm, was built in 1792, and was shingled with hand-made shingles. A few of these have been preserved The first church was built at this time in these have been preserved. The first church was built at this time in the year 17/2 on May Day, it being the first church in Upper Canada ( Nethodist) The Muff burying ground may still be seen at this place.

Their children were:-Elizabeth., whose husband was Rev. Wright, a Methodist minister in Toronto. Mary . . .. whose busband was Joseph Allison, local minister in Adolphustown. Eva . . ... married Cyrus Allison, circuit minister in Allisonville, Pr.Ed.County.

Sarah . ..married Royal Hicks of Allisonville. Margaret . married Edward Squires of Middlesex County. Jane . . married Edward Harrison of Frince Edward County. Millicent . married Teter Van Patten of Picton. Samuel . ..remained on the farm. Henry . .. moved to Hastings County.

John Harrison (Edward Harrison's father) of Harysburg died in 1000 and was buried at Gressy burying ground. His wife died in 1064. Their children were:-John, of South Bay; William, of Gressy; Archibald, of last farm on Lake side; Walter, by Gross Road on Lake side; George, of Rochester; Edward, at Maupoos; Alex. supposed to buve lost his life among the Indians while enroute to California, seeking gold; Margaret Rennic of Maganee, afterward wholesale merchants in Nellic mapried Peter Minaker; Alice married Frederick Minaker of Ficton.

Edward Harrison's family consisted of :-John of Drinee Udward County; George of Adolphustown on the Hoover farm; David of Australia; Archibald of Drinee Udward County( the marrator) Sarah Diza Woodrow of Pieton. For second wife Edward Harrison warried Lucinda Creighton a.d afterwards Hary Hurdock.

William Harrison married Hary Carr of South Harysburg. Their family were; Louis of Hapanee; John Bamund, Day City, Helson of Gressy, who died in his youth; Hichigan. Alfred of Haliburton County; Calvin of Day City; Sam of Cressy died as a young man; Mary Ellen of Michigan; Alvoretta and Mrs. Marner of Ellree Hile Day, H.Y. Denjamin of Cressy.


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
