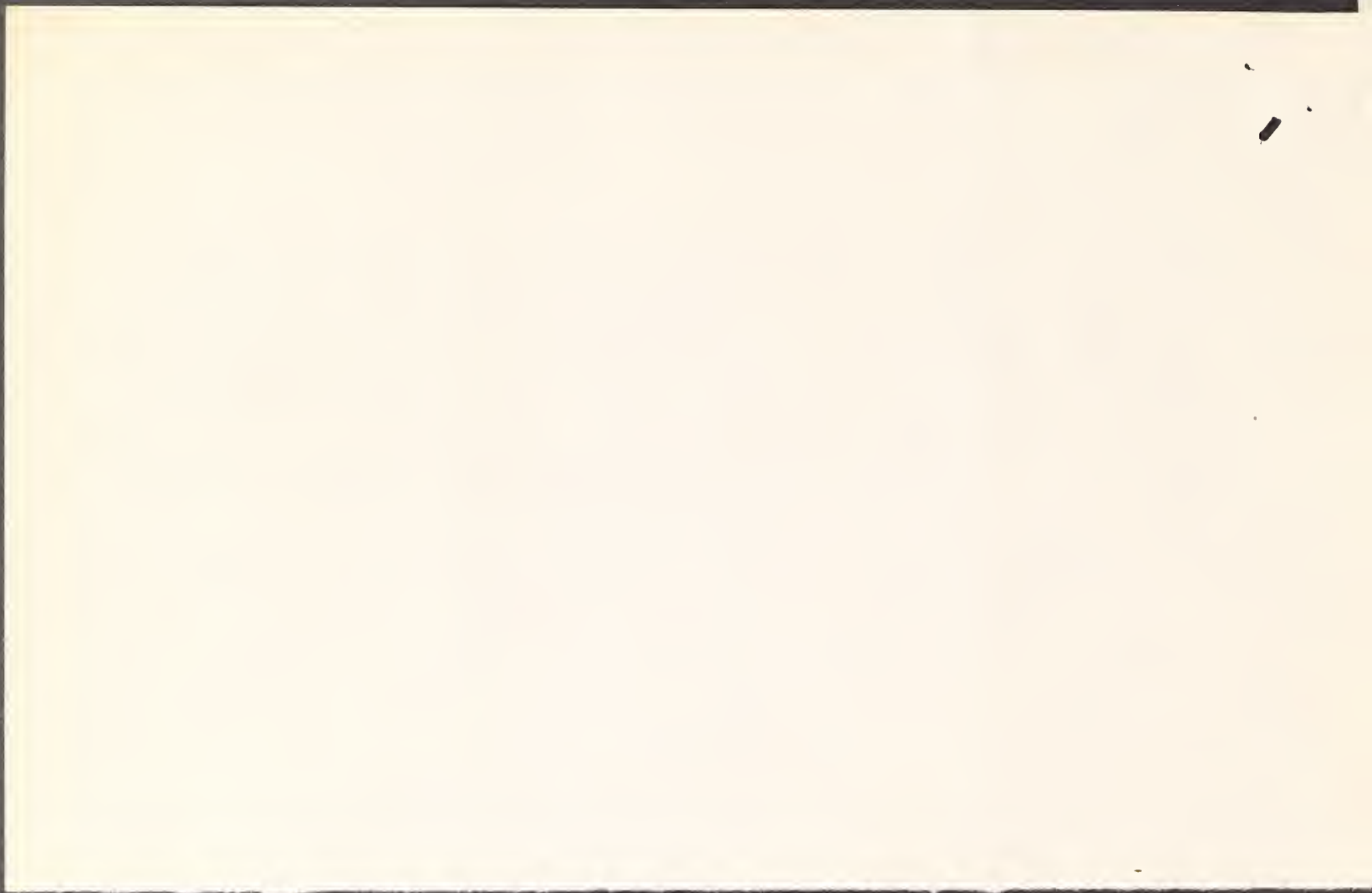
Dear Dr. Burleigh,-

Having been given the enclosed information regarding the pioneer Hoover family at Adolphustown, it has been suggested that I pass it on to you. We have the shingles and other little pieces of antiquity saved from the old house. It is recorded in some of the old books of early Methodism that "services were conducted at Henry Hoover's house on the first concession". We have the original deed from King Geo III, the year 1803.

I think it is not known by anyone else regarding the family of Henry Hoover, and trust this information may be useful sometime to you.

Archibald Harrison married Sarah Connor of the last farm on the Bay side. Her father, Erin Connor walked to Toronto for a law suit previous to the time of railroad, in about 24 hrs.

Their children were:-

Nancy Waggoner; Ellenora Powers; Catherine Hall of Utica;  
Ally Boyd of Cananogue; Emma Minaker; Theolismar of Brandon, Man.  
Edward I. of Cressy; Archibald of Cressy.

Walter Harrison married Mary Storms of Cressy.

Their children were: Daniel; Walter; Irvin on his father's farm by the lower Cross Road; Louisa married Benjamin Harrison; Caroline married Storms; Chester married Isabel Slater; Ida married Irvin Miller, Mahala.

George Harrison of Rochester had three children..

George, William and Emma.

Alex. Harrison had no family.

Margaret Rennie of Napanee had three daughters...

Jane of Napanee.....and a son John.

Joseph Allison married Mary Hoover,-their children were;  
David, John, Henry, Cyrus, Joseph, Edward, Amy Gonselas,  
Elizabeth Box Briden, Miriam of Shannonville, and  
Jane Mallory of Adolphustown.

Cyrus Allison married Eva Hoover,-their children were;  
Theobc Jane who died young, Cyrus also died young,  
William Henry, Mary Ann Appleby, Chas.  
Sarah Branscombe( Gena Branscombe's Mother)  
Jennie Roblin Brewery.

David Allison married Amelia Membery. Their family were.-  
Dr. David, John Benjamin, Raymond J., Mary Allison.

Henry Allison married Martha Wright. Their family were,-  
Frederick and Harry, of Conway. The former remained on the  
the homestead.

Cyrus Allison married Catherine Murdock...one son Roderick.

Joseph Allison married Martha Membery. Their family were,-  
Annie Davis, Arthur, Edna of Honolulu.

Elizabeth Box had one son, Philip.

About the year 1857 the mail from Napanee was taken from Adolphustown to Bengard's regularly. At that time two Turner boys lost their lives enroute during a great storm.

As dictated by Archibald Harrison  
about 1930.

Only the foundation of the Hoover house remains today, portions of it having been used in Harrison's present home.

Historical Items of Adolphustown.

Henry Hoover of German descent, born 1763 and Jane Ann Huff of Mohawk Valley, New York State, born 1773, migrated with the United Empire Loyalists to Adolphustown, June 16th, 1784, with their parents. The government allotted approximately two hundred acres to each family. The Hoover house, on the present Harrison farm, was built in 1792, and was shingled with hand-made shingles. A few of these have been preserved. The first church was built at this time in the year 1792 on May Day, it being the first church in Upper Canada (Methodist) the Huff burying ground may still be seen at this place.

Their children were:-

Elizabeth..whose husband was Rev. Wright, a Methodist minister in Toronto.  
Mary . . .whose husband was Joseph Allison, local minister in Adolphustown.  
Eva . . .married Cyrus Allison, circuit minister in Allisonville, Pr. Ed. County.  
Sarah . . .married Royal Hicks of Allisonville.  
Margaret . married Edward Squires of Middlesex County.  
Jane . . . married Edward Harrison of Prince Edward County.  
Millicent . married Peter Van Dusen of Picton.  
Samuel . .remained on the farm.  
Henry . . . moved to Hastings County.

John Harrison (Edward Harrison's father) of Marysburg died in 1858 and was buried at Cressy burying ground. His wife died in 1861. Their children were:-

John, of South Bay; William, of Cressy;  
Archibald, of last farm on Lake side;  
Walter, by Cross Road on Lake side;  
George, of Rochester; Edward, at Waupoos;  
Alex. supposed to have lost his life among the Indians while enroute to California, seeking gold;  
Margaret Rennie of Napanee, afterward wholesale merchants in Toronto.  
Nellie married Peter Minaker;  
Alice married Frederick Minaker of Picton.

Edward Harrison's family consisted of:-

John of Prince Edward County;  
George of Adolphustown on the Hoover farm;  
David of Australia;  
Archibald of Prince Edward County (the narrator)  
Sarah Eliza Woodrow of Picton.

For second wife Edward Harrison married Lucinda Creighton and afterwards Mary Hardock.

William Harrison married Mary Carr of South Marysburg. Their family were; Louis of Napanee; John Edmund, Bay City, Michigan.  
Nelson of Cressy, who died in his youth;  
Alfred of Haliburton County; Calvin of Bay City;  
Sam of Cressy died as a young man;  
Mary Ellen of Michigan;  
Alvoretta and Mrs. Warner of Three Mile Bay, N.Y.  
Benjamin of Cressy.
