The Petition of George V Ward of Pictou in the
Northward District Power

Humbly Sheweth

That your Petitioner is eldest Son and heir at law
of the late John Ward of Kingston Shipwright, who was
entitled to receive Two hundred Acres of Land for services
as a Shipwright during the late war with the United States,
in the Dockyard at Kingston.

That said John Ward
deceased in the year 1819 at Kingston aforesaid intestate
and said Land not having been located, Petitioner humbly
prays your Excellency that Scrip in lieu thereof may
issue, and as in duty bound Petitioner will pray

Kingston deceased in the Year 1819 Intestate and
without having made any disposition of his
claim for Township and Acres of Land which he

Yard performed by him during the late war as
deponent has always understood and verily believes
That George Valentine Ward of Wellington in the
Prince Edward District is the eldest son
and heir at law of the said John Ward deceased
and that the said John Ward deceased was the
Person in whose name the Surveyor General's Certificate
No 4347 was issued,
