

This is the Last Will and Testament of me James

Parker Lake of the Township of Ernestown  
in the County of Lennox & Addington, and Province of  
Ontario Farmer made this Fourth  
day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and ninety nine

I Revoke all former Wills or other Testimentary Dispositions by me at  
any time heretofore made and declare this only to be and contain my last  
Will and Testament

I Direct all my just debts funeral and Testimentary expenses to be paid  
and satisfied by my Executrix hereinafter named as soon as conveniently  
may be after my decease

I Give, Devise and Bequeath all my Real and Personal Estate  
of which I may die possessed in the manner following, that is to say:

I give to my beloved wife <sup>Eleanora Mabel Lake</sup> the sum of Seven  
hundred dollars.

I give to my son John Franklin Lake  
all that parcel or tract of land consisting  
of the North east quarter of Section Twenty  
six in Township Thirty eight in Range four  
West of the Third meridian in the Provincial  
District of Saskatchewan North West Territories  
absolutely in fee simple.

I give to my daughter Mary Jane Mullett  
the sum of One hundred dollars

I give to my <sup>step-son</sup> James Fraser  
and his wife jointly the sum of One hundred  
dollars

I give to my nephew James Rose son of Amos  
Rose the sum of One hundred dollars on  
condition that he shall put up a headstone  
to the grave of his mother Anna Rose

I give to my son Charles Arthur Lake  
my gold watch.

I direct that all the rest of my real and  
personal estate not hereinbefore specifically  
bequeathed and consisting more particularly  
of a half interest in the West half of lot  
number Four in the Fifth Concession of the  
said Township of Eudotown and part of  
lot number Ten in the Fourth Concession  
of the said Township of Eudotown and  
all my goods chattels and effects be sold  
and converted into cash as soon as  
conveniently may be by my executors after  
my decease and the proceeds derived therefrom  
~~together with my cash which may have at my decease~~  
after payment of the necessary expenses  
hereinbefore bequeathed to be divided equally  
among my three sons Parker A. Lake  
Charles Arthur Lake and John Franklin  
Lake where and share alike.

I desire that my son Parker's share of  
the above proceeds shall be paid over to  
my son John Franklin to hold in trust  
for my said son Parker and paid to  
him in payments of Fifty dollars a year  
until the whole of such share shall have  
been fully paid to my said son Parker.

In addition to the above legacy to my daughter  
Mary Jane Mullet I also give and bequeath to  
her one set of hair bottom chairs, one hair  
bottom sofa, one hall rack, one bedstead  
and bedding, one heavy mattress, a dining room  
and a bedroom carpet, one hanging lamp, one  
clock and one mirror.
